
Adult Forum meets downstairs on Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15. Everyone is welcome.

Voice and Piano Recital on October 13

On Sunday, October 13, 2019, at 3 pm, soprano Margaret Ozaki Graves (who actually serves as the Saint Paul Choir Alto Section Leader) and pianist Jessica Nilles will present a recital featuring works by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (Exsultate, Jubilate), Ludwig van Beethoven (Six Lieder of Gellert), and Gabriel Fauré (Selection of Songs on Spiritual Themes).

Both Margaret and Jessica hold doctorates in music and have extensive performance experience in Colorado, across the country, and internationally. Most recently, they appeared together in Giovanna's with Denver Immersive Opera. The recital is free and open to the public, though donations will be warmly received.

One of the organizations our congregation has long supported is Metro Caring, a great nonprofit providing food and hunger-related resources to those in need in our community. Last winter, our church's Social Justice Committee chose Metro Caring and four other organizations to highlight to our congregation as groups we actively support.

Metro Caring's volunteer coordinator, Jose Navarro, says the organization is actively recruiting for its Food Access volunteer position, which entails working in the warehouse and food market. They are low on volunteers on Monday mornings and Friday afternoons especially, but help is welcome any day of the week.
